Why did you select it?

The painting is simple yet unique. Painted in the late Rococo style, Fragonard has used fluid, freeing strokes for the woman's gown and dog, whereas her face has slightly more detail. The colours and mood of the image feels light-hearted and fun, whilst also being extravagant. I chose this painting as the Rococo-era was one of my favourite eras for art, with its elegant colouring and somewhat fantastical elements, it was a curious era for a time when classical art was praised.

The pink tones of the woman's gown and her red cheeks gives a cheerful impression, the small bow on the dog (who is just as small) is endearing, so there's no doubt this was painted with good spirits of both the model and the painter.

Technique

The portrait was made using oil on canvas, with quick, broad brush strokes, (minus the face). It was notable that Fragonard would lay down the foundations using red and yellow paints, followed by mixes of warmer colours with white to create the rest of the portrait. A lot of white is used in this painting, which gives it a lighter feel, and the warm colours create a sense of comfort within the image. The sitter is framed very slightly off-centre but has a confident stance.

Last thoughts

Would you recommend it to someone? Was it interesting? Thought provoking? Is it relatable? What could perhaps be done differently?

Although not the most thought-provoking piece of art, or riddled with symbolism, it's a fun and charming portrait that was quite rare to see for the time. The humorous nature makes it a fairly relatable piece since it's not much different from an image of your everyday person with their dog.
